	All Students	
K-8	 Hats and hoods may NOT be worn inside the school building. Wearing a hat outdoors during PE or recess is acceptable. Physical Education Attire Girls should wear shorts or leggings under their skirts. Athletic shoes are required for all activities. DAT Spirit Wear (Tops ONLY) Permitted every day of the year! Additional options for spirit wear will be available to purchase. Outerwear - such as sweatshirts, sweaters, jackets - We understand that our students require sweaters/sweatshirts for warmth both indoors and outdoors. We ask that they maintain alignment with our overall dress code with being solid colored and limiting wording/images. Kindergarten	 Pants (including jeans), shorts, and skirts are permitted Shorts, skirts, and dresses must reach mid-thigh or lower All tops are acceptable except for halter/tank tops and "spaghetti strap" blouses/dresses No flip flops, backless shoes, heels, Crocs, etc allowed 	 Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times Non-collared shirts are permitted Jeans and shorts are permitted No flip flops, backless shoes, or Crocs are permitted
Lower School (Grades 1-5)	 Any solid navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black skirt that covers the knee while standing and sitting; denim is not permitted Any solid colored shirt with a collar (no words, logos, or images will be permitted) Tops should cover the torso while sitting, standing, or bending Dresses must be navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black, have a collar, and follow appropriate sleeve and skirt length. No cap-sleeved or sleeveless tops may be worn Undergarments should not be visible No sandals, heels, flip flops, Crocs, beach shoes, Heelys, or open toe shoes are permitted Leggings worn under appropriate length skirts are permitted Pants are not to be worn under skirts (pajama or otherwise) Hairstyles must be appropriate for school. Dyed hair is not permitted. 	 Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times Any solid navy blue, black, gray, or khaki (tan) pants; denim is not permitted; No sweatpants, athletic pants, joggers, cargo pants, or anything similar are permitted Pants are unacceptable when ripped, excessively tight, oversized, discolored, or washed out Any solid colored shirt with a collar (no words, logos, or images will be permitted) Undergarments should not be visible Traditional hairstyles that conform to halacha are appropriate for school. Hair must be of a length that is both neat and presentable, reflecting the basic appearance of a ben Torah; no excessively long or short hair (subject to administrative discretion) is permitted, nor is dyed hair No sandals, flip flops, beach shoes, Crocs, Heelys, or open toe shoes are permitted.

Middle School (Grades 6-8)	 Any solid navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black skater, A-line, straight, or flared maxi skirt that covers the knee while standing and sitting; denim of any color is not permitted Pencil skirts or "skirt leggings" are not permitted; (please note skirt length when purchasing) If a skirt has a slit, the slit should not come above the knee. Any shirt with a collar; can be polo, button down style, or without buttons Button down shirts must be worn buttoned (no words, large logos, or images will be permitted) Sleeves must cover the upper arm and come to or below the elbow Undergarments should not be visible Tops should cover the torso while sitting, standing, or bending No sandals, flip flops, beach shoes, Heelys, Crocs, or open toe shoes are permitted Leggings worn under appropriate length skirts are permitted Pants are not to be worn under skirts (pajama or otherwise) Hairstyles must be appropriate for school. Dyed hair is not permitted Earrings are permitted only in the ear. Other body piercings and tattoos are prohibited. 	 Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times Any solid navy blue, black, gray, or khaki (tan) pants; denim of any color is not permitted No sweatpants, athletic pants, cargo pants, or anything similar are permitted Pants are unacceptable when ripped, excessively tight, oversized, discolored, or washed out Any shirt with a collar; can be polo or button-down style Button down shirts must be worn buttoned (no words, large logos, or images will be permitted) Undergarments should not be visible Traditional hairstyles that conform to halacha are appropriate for school. High School (Grades 9-12)	 Any solid navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black skater, A-line, straight, or flared maxi skirt that covers the knees while standing and sitting; denim of any color is not permitted Pencil skirts or "skirt leggings" of any length are not permitted; straight skirts are permitted (please note skirt length when purchasing) If a skirt has a slit, the slit should not come above the knee Any shirt with neckline no lower than collarbone; sleeves must cover the upper arm and come to or below the elbow DAT apparel (tops only) and Israel/IDF/US Armed Forces apparel is acceptable; other logos are also acceptable, provided they do not demonstrate profanity, innuendo, 	 Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times Any solid navy blue, black, gray, or khaki (tan) pants; denim of any color is not permitted No sweatpants, athletic pants, cargo pants, joggers, or anything similar are permitted Pants are unacceptable when ripped, excessively tight, oversized, discolored, or washed out DAT apparel (tops only) and Israel/IDF/US Armed Forces apparel is acceptable; other logos are also acceptable, provided they do not demonstrate profanity, innuendo, violence, or anything that contradicts DAT values Undergarments should not be visible Traditional hairstyles that conform to halacha are appropriate for school. Hair must be of a length that is both neat and presentable, reflecting the basic appearance of a ben Torah;

Dyed hair permitted only in natural colors Earrings are permitted only in the ear.
