| K-8 | Hats <br> - Hats and hoods may NOT be worn inside the school building. <br> - Wearing a hat outdoors during PE or recess is acceptable. <br> Physical Education Attire <br> - Girls should wear shorts or leggings under their skirts. <br> - Athletic shoes are required for all activities. <br> DAT Spirit Wear (Tops ONLY) <br> - Permitted every day of the year! Additional options for spirit wear will be available to purchase. <br> Outerwear - such as sweatshirts, sweaters, jackets - <br> We understand that our students require sweaters/sweatshirts for warmth both indoors and outdoors. | Kindergarten | - Pants (including jeans), shorts, and skirts are permitted <br> - Shorts, skirts, and dresses must reach mid-thigh or lower <br> - All tops are acceptable except for halter/tank tops and "spaghetti strap" blouses/dresses <br> - No flip flops, backless shoes, heels, Crocs, etc allowed | - Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times <br> - Non-collared shirts are permitted <br> - Jeans and shorts are permitted <br> - No flip flops, backless shoes, or Crocs are permitted |
| Lower <br> School <br> (Grades <br> 1-5) | - Any solid navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black skirt that covers the knee while standing and sitting; denim is not permitted <br> - Any solid colored shirt with a collar (no words, logos, or images will be permitted) <br> - Tops should cover the torso while sitting, standing, or bending <br> - Dresses must be navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black, have a collar, and follow appropriate sleeve and skirt length. <br> - No cap-sleeved or sleeveless tops may be worn <br> - Undergarments should not be visible <br> - No sandals, heels, flip flops, Crocs, beach shoes, Heelys, or open toe shoes are permitted <br> - Leggings worn under appropriate length skirts are permitted <br> - Pants are not to be worn under skirts (pajama or otherwise) <br> - Hairstyles must be appropriate for school. | High <br> School <br> (Grades 9-12) | - Any solid navy, khaki (tan), gray, or black skater, A-line, straight, or flared maxi skirt that covers the knees while standing and sitting; denim of any color is not permitted <br> - Pencil skirts or "skirt leggings" of any length are not permitted; straight skirts are permitted (please note skirt length when purchasing) <br> - If a skirt has a slit, the slit should not come above the knee <br> - Any shirt with neckline no lower than collarbone; sleeves must cover the upper arm and come to or below the elbow <br> - DAT apparel (tops only) and Israel/IDF/US Armed Forces apparel is acceptable; other logos are also acceptable, provided they do not demonstrate profanity, innuendo, | - Tzitzit and Kippah must be worn at all times <br> - Any solid navy blue, black, gray, or khaki (tan) pants; denim of any color is not permitted <br> - No sweatpants, athletic pants, cargo pants, joggers, or anything similar are permitted <br> - Pants are unacceptable when ripped, excessively tight, oversized, discolored, or washed out <br> - DAT apparel (tops only) and Israel/IDF/US Armed Forces apparel is acceptable; other logos are also acceptable, provided they do not demonstrate profanity, innuendo, violence, or anything that contradicts DAT values <br> - Undergarments should not be visible <br> - Traditional hairstyles that conform to halacha are appropriate for school.
